SPECIAL EXHIBIT: GULAG: Soviet Forced Labor Camps and the Struggle for Freedom

Through October 21, 2007, Manzanar NHS and the Eastern California Museum host the first exhibition in the U.S. on the Soviet Gulag. SPECIAL EXHIBIT: Selected Artists from the Henry Fukuhara Annual Alabama Hills and Manzanar Workshop

Third annual exhibit of paintings by renowned artist Henry Fukuhara and his talented students, featuring scenes of, or inspired by, the Manzanar and Owens Valley landscape. On display at the Manzanar Interpretive Center April 20 – May 6.

Friday, April 13, 2:25 p.m. “What’s in a Place Name?” (30 minute talk)

Owens Valley Paiute, explorers, pioneers, and mountain climbers figure prominently in the naming of the Eastern Sierra. Join Park Ranger R. Potashin to hear the stories behind the peaks.

Join Park Ranger M. Hachtmann for a special screening of an Academy Award-winning documentary about artist Estelle Ishigo, a Caucasian woman who was interned with her Japanese American husband at Heart Mountain, Wyoming from 1942 through 1945. (28 minutes, following by Q & A).
